Bias Motivated Incidents Report Discussion

• A total of twenty-one incidents were reported during the summer/fall period of 2008. One of them could not be substantiated and therefore was discarded, bringing the total to twenty. This was significantly lower than the thirty-three incidents reported for the summer/fall period of 2007, and the twenty-five incidents reported for the spring period of 2008.

- Eighteen reports received were from the University Park campus; one report received was from the Hershey Medical Center; and one report received was from the Berks campus.
- When it was possible and if the submitter provided contact information, each case submission was followed up with a contact by the Diversity Advocate. In a few instances, the targeted person was encouraged to make or had already made an additional police report. Where the perpetrator was known, contact with that individual and that individual's supervisor was made. This occurred in two instances. In two other instances involving classroom instructors, the Affirmative Action Office was notified to follow-up in each case.
- As always, confidentiality of identities and information will be respected, unless otherwise indicated by the submitter or targeted person.
- Multiple categories often exist for the Status of Targeted Persons, Race/Ethnicity, Targeted Issues, and Types of Offense. An effort is made to indicate one choice, and which best describes an incident or individual, or how that individual may identify themselves. However, in some instances where appropriate and where overlap exists, more than one category is chosen and indicated. This accounts for the occasional slightly higher numbers within a category than the total number of reports given. In addition, two perpetrators may have acted in concert, or more than one individual may have been targeted during one incident.

Finally, the intended target for a perpetrator may be a student organization or the Penn State University community in general, or a subgroup of the community, and the numbers of those targeted cannot be determined.

• The data collection forms were not always similar from campuses and police. For example, the time of the incident is more exact within the police reports received. Therefore, this statistical account still represents varied information about time, characteristics of targeted individuals, those who submitted reports, and perpetrators. An effort was made to gain clarification in such instances. Efforts continue to be made to ensure uniformity of data gathered and reported.
